God's Predestined Will

Isa 14:24; John 6:37-39; Acts 13:48; Rom 9:10-23; Eph 1:3-14; 1 Cor 12:7,11; Ps 139:13-14; Ps 139:16

God's Prescribed Will in Scripture

Matt 22:37-40; 1 Pet 1:16; 1 Cor 10:31

Everything you need to know and do, to completely obey and please God, has already been recorded in Scripture! (Ps 119:1-3, 9; 1 Cor 4:6)

God's Permissive Will

God's Permissive Will are things for which God does <u>not</u> have a will at all, but leaves completely up to our own free will, desires, and logical reasoning.

God's will for all of your decisions is: 1) Obey Scripture with all your soul and strength, 2) Make wise decisions with your mind, and 3) Follow the desires of your heart. (Gen 2:16-17).

If you were to ask God what He wanted you to do in a decision that is not addressed in Scripture, do you know what He would say? "Do what you want, and I will bless it."

God's Prayed for Will

James 4:2; 2 Kings 20:1-6; Matt 7:7-8

We can bring something into God's Will by asking for it.

(Prov 16:9) The mind of man [wisely] plans his way [and the heart of man pursues his good desires]. But the LORD directs his steps in ways we may not be able to recognize or explain.
